




New CNSST Social Housing Portfolio: On 26 May, CNSST successfully purchased 16.03 hectares of rural farm land in Wellsford Auckland, as the base for future development of CNSST Eco-Park.



Due to the COVID-19 resurgence, CNSST resumed its "Unite Against Covid-19" service response system on 18 August 2021 for the provision of online wrap-around support and contactless food parcel delivery, benefiting 9,588 people.



An appreciation event was held for the community team of 87 volunteers that was established for food parcel delivery, information and vaccination support to vulnerable ethnic families or those in isolation.



CNSST Cultural Learning Centre was restructured in April 2022 by closing down Manukau and New Lynn Centres, merging the existing classes online to ensure their financial viability.



On 21st Sept 2021, CNSST organised our first online anniversary celebration - the CNSST 23rd Anniversary, with the participation of our current board, staff, contractors and volunteers.



On 19th Jan 2022, CNSST Cultural Learning Centre signed an international partnership agreement with Runzhou District Experimental Primary School as Sister School for Chinese language and cultural education.

Improved staff health, safety and wellbeing: All head office staff are provided with the adjustable desks and the options of a flexible new work model.



CNSST International Department achieved the milestone of signing the MoU with Hong Kong Shue Yan University for the provision of overseas field placement in New Zealand.



Extended parenting programme in partnership with local schools, especially focusing on addressing parent-child conflicts and providing positive parenting skills, benefiting 249 parents.



Established the Gen-Z Reporters New Zealand Station in partnership with Chinese Language and Cultural Education Foundation and Cubeekids Group, with the membership of 69 Kiwi-Chinese young reporters.



CNSST as the ethnic partner of Massey University HART Team, successfully engaged 1,159 older Chinese people in the 2021 New Zealand Health, Work and Retirement study COVID Response.



CNSSTEI successfully achieved NZQA approval of its Chinese Cultural Competency Training Programme (CCCTP).

CNSST Foundation(CNSST), formerly known as Chinese New Settlers Services Trust, began in the founder Jenny Wang's home garage in September 1998. As a registered charitable trust, CNSST Foundation offers culturally and linguistically appropriate services to both Ethnic new settlers and the community as a whole in New Zealand.



Our Mission:

To improve the quality of life of the Ethnic New Zealanders.

Our Goal:

To establish Ethnic community multi-service centres and to help all the new settlers to integrate and contribute to New Zealand society through our services delivery.

Our Vision:

To work towards meeting the needs of the Ethnic seniors, children and young people, and all other new settlers, and to facilitate the successful integration of the new settlers into wider New Zealand society.

 Holiday programmes, Chinese language & cultural training, and after school programmes for local young people at our seven cultural learning centres in Auckland.


Social Housing
